

Co-Sponsor a Refugee Family with IRC

Help Welcome Refugees to Your Community

A **Co-Sponsor** welcomes refugees and other vulnerable populations alongside the IRC. Co-Sponsors serve as partners and friends who empower newcomers to navigate their new, unfamiliar environment and work towards self-sufficiency. Co-Sponsors mobilize community resources and connection to assist the IRC expand comprehensive, personalized refugee services.

Individuals may not serve as co-sponsors.



Becoming a co-sponsor is a direct way to support the resettlement of vulnerable refugee families placed in New Jersey and within 100 miles of Elizabeth. As a group, you take the lead in supporting these new arrivals to your community and agree to take on the responsibility of fulfilling a majority or all the requirements of the R&P program. Families will be assigned to your group by the IRC NJ. IRC will provide technical assistance and training as well as a dedicated staff member as a point of contact. Your group will be coordinating and problem solving on the ground to provide for the unique needs of each arriving case.

The time commitment for a cosponsorship is six to twelve months.

IRC Support

The IRC will work with the co-sponsor in providing technical assistance and training. IRC will support the group to ensure all delegated R&P services are completed accurately and on time for the case. IRC staff will maintain regular contact with the cosponsor and the case to assist with any needs that may arise.

- 1. Secure a safe, sanitary, and affordable housing unit for the family that is available for at least 6-12 months.
- 2. Ensure housing is equipped with appropriate household items.
- 3. Greet and welcome the family at the airport.
- 4. Provide food and items for basic needs.
- 5. Connect adults to English class.
- 6. Enroll minors in school.
- 7. Connect to cultural orientation and integration services.
- 8. Enroll family in public benefits.
- 9. Connect adults to employment services.
- 10. Connect family with medical care and provide transportation.
- 11. Ensure completion of required documentation and registration.
 - · Address Change, Selective Service
 - · Social Security Card, State ID, EAD
- 12. Secure Interpretation services in the client's native language.

Become a Co-Sponsor

- Attend an informational or conduct a oneon-one meeting with IRC staff to review program requirements.
- Complete an application, which outlines your group's capabilities and commitment.
- Receive training on how to work with refugees and complete delegated core services.
- Pass an IRC background check for each member of the group.
- Sign an agreement with IRC to be a cosponsor.
- Participate in weekly check-ins with IRC.
