Only 9% of the UAC Pakistan (16%) and Bangladesh Turkey and Turkish Kurdistan, India (13%) and Sri Lanka encountered have asked for support followed by Svria and Afghanistan (11%). 51% of single adult men (10%). 55% said they were to enter the minors' reception system (11%). Only 11% of the family units indicate that they are in transit to traveling to other countries, declared Trieste. The main in declared that they intend to seek other countries. 31% intend to seek primarily Spain and Portugal. destinations are Germany, asylum in Italy. The primary declared asylum in Trieste. Switzerland and France. destination remains Germany.

An average of 3 new single adult **women** was reached each day

This snapshot shows the numbers of new migrants arriving from the Balkan route encountered by International Rescue Committee Italy and Diaconia Valdese in Trieste central station area during the reporting period. The data was gathered through individual and group interviews with people reached to provide legal orientation and first aid.
