







People arriving from the Balkan route in Trieste (Italian-Slovenian border)

Single adult men

60% out of the total

61% of single adult men said they intended to continue their journey to other countries, while 26% intended to seek asylum in Trieste. The main countries of origin remain **Afghanistan** (50%), **Pakistan** (16%) and **Bangladesh** (10%).

An average of **40 new single adult men** were reached every day

Unaccompanied Children (UAC)

out of the total

The main countries of origin were Afghanistan (62%), Syria (22%) and Egypt (14%). 83% of UACs declared they were traveling, with main destinations Germany, Switzerland and France. Of those, 17 UAC intended to reunite with their close family members. Only 19 UACs asked support to enter the reception circuit in Trieste.

An average of 11 **new UAC** were reached every day

out of the total representing **435** individuals (including **236** children)

44% of the families were from **Turkish Kurdistan** and 23% from **Turkey**, 23% from **Syria**. 11 single-parent families met. In 67% of cases, families reported that they were traveling to other countries (90% in Germany) and in 26% of cases they chose not to share their destination.

An average of 2 **new family unit** was reached every day

Single adult women

53% of single adult women were from **Nepal**, the other main nationalities were **Sri Lanka**, **Congo**, **Nigeria**, and **Syria**. 42% said they were planning to stop in Trieste to apply for asylum, while 42% said they were traveling to other countries, with main destinations Spain and France.

An average of 1 **new single adult women** was reached each day

This snapshot shows the numbers of new migrants arriving from the Balkan route encountered by International Rescue Committee Italy and Diaconia Valdese in Trieste central station area during the reporting period. The data was gathered through individual and group interviews with people reached to provide legal orientation and first aid.
