






Single adult men

75%

out of the total

The main countries of origin Afghanistan (33%), Bangladesh (24%) and Pakistan (19%).

53% of single adult men declared they intended to seek asylum in Trieste (252 people), confirming the upward trend from previous months.

An average of 15 new single adult **men** were reached every day

Unaccompanied Children (UAC)

11%

out of the total

main countries origin Afghanistan (75%), Syria (18%) and **Egypt** (4%).

76% declared they were traveling to other countries, with main destinations Germany, and Switzerland. Only 8 UACs asked support to enter the reception system for unaccompanied children in Trieste (11%).

> An average of 2 new UAC were reached every day

Family Units **19**%

out of the total representing 77 individuals (including 10 children)

The main countries of origin are Turkey (62%), Afghanistan (18%) and Svria (10%).

56% of the families declared they were traveling to other countries (77% in Germany). 35% of cases have unknown destination.

An average 1 new family unit was reached every other day

14 🐫 **Single** adult women out of the total

The main countries of origin are Nepal (71%),China (15%) and India (14%).

Almost all single adult women (86%) decided to stop and seek asylum in Trieste this month.

An average of 1 new single adult **women** was reached every other day

This snapshot shows the numbers of new migrants arriving from the Balkan route encountered by International Rescue Committee Italy and Diaconia Valdese in Trieste central station area during the reporting period. The data was gathered through individual and group interviews with people reached to provide legal orientation and first aid.
